DID I GO TO THE BATHROOM

If I need to go to the bathroom during the performance, I'll miss part of the story and disturb others. It is better for everyone if I visit the bathroom before the show.



I DO NOT TAKE PICTURES

A play is a work of art subject to quite a few regulations. If I want pictures I do not use my camera, I simply ask my teacher.



I LISTEN QUIETLY

To fully understand the play's storyline, I listen intently. I'll exchange comments with my classmates after the performance is over.



I DO NOT EAT OR DRINK DURING THE PLAY

If I get a hungry or thirsty, I wait until the end of the performance to get a snack or a drink.



PARTICIPATING IN THE PLAY

If an actor or actress asks me to participate, I am free to do so if I want to. Otherwise, I am invited to listen carefully.



I SEAT COMFORTABLY

To avoid disrupting the play and to seat comfortably, I take off my coat and I put down my bag.



I EXPERIENCE EMOTIONS

Sometimes, a play can make us want to cry or laugh. However, I keep in mind that pretending is reserved for on-stage acting. Indeed, overreactions can disturb the rest of the audience.



THE PLAY IS ABOUT TO START

Silence, actors are entering the scene!



THE PLAY IS OVER

The curtain call is about to happen. I applaud to thank the actors and actresses. It will also be a good time to ask questions.



I PUT AWAY MY PERSONAL BELONGINGS

If I have toys or other personal items, I put them away until the show is over. Otherwise they will be confiscated to prevent me from bothering my classmates.
